### **Governor Moore Announces Discovery of Home at Harriet Tubman Birthplace**

Governor Wes Moore joined local, state, and federal partners on February 14 for the announcement that Maryland archaeologists had discovered a home where enslaved people lived on the Thompson Farm, the birthplace of Harriet Tubman. The excavation also revealed hundreds of artifacts, including a West African spirit cache. The artifacts were found in the ruins of an enslaved overseer's house not far from the home of Ben Ross, Tubman's father.

"Harriet Tubman's birthplace is sacred ground, and this discovery is part of our ongoing commitment to preserve the legacy of those who lived here," said Governor Moore. "The find reveals untold stories of the past that help us both understand the history we share and inspire us to make a better future." Learn more about the discovery here.
