The visit included a trip to the scenic dock on the Potomac River, a hike along one of the park's many trails, and a tour of the National Colonial Farm. They also provided an overview of the park's recent efforts to update the stories of the Piscataway people who lived on the land that the park now occupies. Piscataway Park plans to rework their digital, print, and interpretive offerings to reflect the findings of this new research in the coming months.
