"I invite chefs from across the state to submit their most creative recipes using fresh, local ingredients as I invite all Marylanders to help strengthen the state's economy and buy local."

"Buying local is just one way Marylanders can stay involved in agriculture and their community," said Maryland Department of Agriculture Secretary Kevin Atticks. "Making Maryland farms profitable creates a stronger economy."



Historical Park's exceptional efforts throughout the reconstruction and stabilization of the 0.9-mile stretch of the Chesapeake & Ohio (C&O) Canal between McMahon's Mill and Lock 42. The total project cost was \$21 million. The National Park Service was presented with the Maryland Historical Trust's Excellence in Historic Preservation and Sustainable Design Award for 2023. Riford was joined by Senator Ben Cardin, Congressman David Trone and others at the event.

Twenty-fifth Anniversary of the National Network to Freedom Act is Focus of Video Project

On June 5, OTD's Managing Director Liz Fitzsimmons and Senior Assistant Director for Tourism Development, Marci Ross sat for an interview with veteran journalist Bob Nelson at the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad State Park. The video segment will celebrate the 25th anniversary of the Network to Freedom Act on July 21, 2023, and Nelson will incorporate the interview into a larger story about nationwide collaboration across the Underground Railroad community. More specifically, the piece will explore efforts within the Network to Freedom to: advance this important history; demonstrate the wideranging impact of the Network to Freedom in preservation, interpretation, education, and historical research and scholarship; reflect on the value of knowing this history as society confronts contemporary issues; underscore the importance of public engagement programs such as the

Network to Freedom, the Reconstruction Era Historic Network, and the African American Civil Rights Network and tie these efforts to tourism outcomes.
